Guidance for handling disability issues at ETSG events

A few simple adjustments can make all the difference to the smooth running and inclusivity of conferences and other events.

- 1. Ask the person with the disability what his/her needs are.
- 2. Speak directly to the person and listen to the answer.
- 3. Remember that they probably have more experience of handling difficulties than you do. If a problem looks insoluble, ask if they have experienced it before and if a strategy is already in place for handling it.
- 4. Prepare a plan in advance so that both parties know what to expect. Ensure that the disabled person knows who to go to if things go wrong on the day.
- 5. Remember the right of a disabled person to ask for a 'reasonable adjustment' from institutions (Equality Act 2010). Most academic and government organisations will understand this and provide help free of charge, to support the inclusion of people with disabilities.
- 6. If things go wrong, avoid allocating blame. Keep the language and tone positive and friendly.
